CDL Class A Adult Day & Evening Program

The CDL Class A Program prepares students to drive multiple types of large vehicles including tractor-trailers, double trailers, tanker vehicles, and more. The variation of different vehicles allows more opportunities to work for different types of hauling, freight, and other commercial vehicle dependent companies.

Theory, Skills & Road

ELDT (Online) – Students will learn the five essential components to the CDL Knowledge test. Basic Operation, Safe Operating Practices, Advanced Operating Practices, Vehicle Systems & Reporting Malfunctions and Non-Driving. (40/4)

Air Brakes (In person) – In this section, students will learn air brakes. (10/1)

Log Books (In person) – In this section, students will learn how to properly maintain a log book. (10/1)

CDL Prep (In person) – In this section, students will prepare for the knowledge test. (10/1)

Driving Simulator (In person) – In this section, students will practice shifting. (10/1)

Behind the Wheel (In person) – Students will learn and practice Pre-Trip Inspections, Drop and Hook, CDL Basic Control Skills (BCS) include: Straight Line Backing, Right Turns, Parallel Parking, Alley Docking, and Backward Serpentine. CDL on Road Driving includes: Basic Shifting Techniques, 4 Lane Highway Driving, 2 Lane Highway Driving, and Uphill/Downhill Driving Techniques. Students will then complete the CDL Driving Test. (160/8)

Tuition – Theory \$1,600, Skills & Road \$3,200

Program Fees \$385 (\$185 if not taking the theory portion)

{Physical & Drug Screening = \$160, Background check = \$25, ELDT = \$200}

Admission Requirements

Complete an application & pay the non-refundable registration fee to reserve a seat

Be at least 18 years old with a valid driver's license.

Have funding sources secure and submit any award letters (if applicable) 10 days prior to the start.

Have a clean State Police Background check.

Pass a DOT Physical & Drug Screening prior to the start of class (must be done at Schuylkill Health OccMed Center)

Have an acceptable driving record (MVR)

Be able to read & speak English as per the Federal Motor Carriers Safety Compliance Manual Part 391.11 (section)(a)(2)

Graduation Requirements

Complete all classroom assignments, tests and all skills/theory training.

Earn an overall grade point average of 80% or higher.

Be in compliance with the attendance policy outlined in the student handbook.

Have all tuition and fees paid to ZERO balance.

Once graduation requirements are met students will receive a certificate of completion as prescribed by the IU/STC Board of Directors and a Class A driver's license.
